This organization is strong, really strong. We were there for our kids, and their families, when the world's circumstances were most uncertain.

You can see, given the size of our operating budget, by all means, the story could be different. But the heart and soul of 15-LOVE cannot be plotted on a graph. It is this unwavering commitment to our kids since 1990 which has driven us to meet them where they are, grow programs, and to do this when times are most challenging.

FROM THE executive director, Amber Marino



2021 had so many bright spots! 15-LOVE had a record high summer program, serving over 4,000 youth through our regular program and our partnerships with the Albany and Schenectady School District enrichment programs. While we weren't allowed into many school buildings for the first part of the year, we were virtual then and back full-force in the second half of the year. We were able to hold in-person tennis classes throughout the winter at community centers and tennis clubs. Our education programs were hybrid, depending on the numbers. But most importantly, kids stayed engaged. Families reached out because they trusted us and relied on our services to help make up the difference in lost educational time in schools,

lost social time, and lost physical activity all around. At the same time, 2021 was nothing short of a challenging year. The stress from the continued pandemic was weighing down on many. While parents were grateful for the program, we also received discouraging phone calls and emails often over things out of our control (something we aren't very used to). I spoke to colleagues in schools and other organizations from around the country, and I know that we were not alone in this, but that didn't make it much easier.

What I came to realize as we were was getting criticized for things like disappointing families because we had to cancel classes in a rain storm, was that it was a funny way of sending us a compliment. It meant that the program was (and still is) needed. It meant that families relied on us to provide something that either no one else could, or at least no program that the family could afford. And parents in the Summer of 2021 had been through the toughest school year anyone had ever known. At times, each day was a new adventure, not knowing if your child's school would shut down due to high numbers, or if your child would have a sniffle that would keep them home and require a test that could take up to 10 days to come back. It was a lot. And, the result of that left us all stressed and on edge. By the end of the summer, we all felt like we had been through the ringer. But now that some time has passed and we can reflect, it was a privilege. It was affirming to know that families rely so heavily on the program. It was a joy to see the smiling faces and hear the laughter. It was an honor to serve our community. And, we will continue to serve and do our best. We will continue to approach our families with the kindness that we know they need, understanding that the stress and trauma is sometimes too much. That's what we are here for. That's what we've always been here for. It's just become more obvious.

So, thank you for your support. Thank you for allowing us to serve our community and families and parents and kids. Thank you for the tough phone calls. Thank you for the smiles and the laughter. Without the support of so many, none of it would be possible. And, unfortunately, in order for us to truly serve our kids and families, we need to see what they need, and that often requires seeing them at their most vulnerable. 2021 provided that opportunity, and we are a stronger organization in 2022 because of it.






